*Name of the Scheme:* State Agriculture Awards.

*Introduction:* Government of Goa had introduced State Agriculture Awards (SAA) for

outstanding agriculturist of the State. It is proposed to continue with the same scheme during the year. The scheme is therefore notified for information of general public.

1. *Short title and commencement.*— (i) The scheme shall be called “State Agriculture Awards”.

(ii) The scheme shall come into force with immediate effect and shall remain in force till it is withdrawn.

(iii) The scheme shall cover all talukas of the Goa State.

2. *Objectives.*— (1) To recognize efforts put in by the self cultivating farmers in Agriculture and Horticulture.

(2) To recognize the outstanding performance of farmers for using innovative and best practices in Agriculture and Horticulture.

(3) To boost the morale of farmers in improvement of productivity in Agricultural and Horticultural crops.

3. *Eligibility.*— (1) The applicant should be fulltime resident of Goa and fulltime farmer.

(2) Applicant should be totally dependent on agriculture as his main source of income.

(3) Applicant should integrate various agriculture activities to generate maximum income from his available land.

(4) Applicant should exhibit originality in his agricultural venture.

(5) Applicant should have minimum of 1ha area of his own or inherited or on long lease.

(6) Applicant should not be recipient of State Krishi Award in the past.

(7) Companies, institutions or any organization will not be eligible for awards.

4. *Pattern of Assistance for State Award.*— The Krishi Ratna shall be considered as the lifetime achievement award and awarded to the Best Farmer of the State while Krishi Vibhushan and Krishi Bhushan shall be awarded to the 2nd best and 3rd best respectively.

The awards shall be presented to the outstanding farmer of Goa which would include Cash Award and Citation as below:—

1. Krishi Ratna	-----	Rs. 2.00 lakhs
2. Krishi Vibhushan	-----	Rs. 1.00 lakhs
3. Krishi Bhushan	-----	Rs. 0.50 lakhs

Honorarium shall be paid to the Judging Committee as detailed below:

1. Official member of the judging committee shall not be paid any allowance.

2. Non Official members shall be paid Rs. 5,000/- lumpsum honorarium for the entire selection process.

The outstation judges shall be provided free accommodation and boarding by the Government or reimbursed at the rate of Rs. 3,000/- for lodging and Rs. 500/- for boarding per day. Travel cost shall be provided by the Department of Agriculture for outstation judges as per actual for AC II tier or @ Rs. 15/-per km towards hired taxi charges whichever is adopted.

The miscellaneous expenditure towards award ceremony, presentation of citation, certificate, bouquets, travel cost of recipient etc., shall be borne by the Government.

*Selection.*— The criteria for selection for award shall be based on the following parameter.

(1) Integration of various activities in agriculture and allied Sector to tap maximum out put from available sources on farm.

(2) Innovative methods adopted by farmer which could be replicated by other farmers.

(3) Potential for influencing other farmer for higher yield and productivity.

(4) Originality in venture undertaken.

(5) Record of farm accounts, yield & expenditure.

(6) Exploration of new method for marketing and value addition of agriculture produce, etc.

(7) Demonstration on Agriculture/Horticulture ventures as economically viable activity.

*Judging Committee.*—The nominees for State Agriculture Award shall be judged by the Government nominated Committee. To bring in transparency and better selection process for the prestigious State awards, the selection process will consist of judges from outside State Government with Department of Agriculture as Nodal Department and Director of Agriculture as Member Secretary.

The recommendation of the Committee shall be considered by Government for final approval.

*Application form.*— The form for application of the award is annexed.

The prescribed forms will be made available to desiring farmer with concerned Zonal Agricultural Offices.

*Relaxation.*— The Government shall be empowered to relax any or all clauses or conditions of the scheme in genuine cases. However for release of financial assistance in such case will be considered only with approval of Finance (Exp.) Department.

*Interpretation.*— If any question arises regarding interpretation of any clause, word, expression of the scheme, the decision shall lie with the Government, which shall be final and binding on all concerned.

*Redressal of grievances and disputes.*— Grievances if any, arising out of the implementation of this scheme, shall be heard and decided by the Minister for Agriculture and the decision of the Minister for Agriculture in this regard shall be final and binding on all concerned.

*Scheme.*— Revised Scheme to finance in the form of loan, to the Government Aided Educational Institutions for the purpose of their upkeep and maintenance and upgrade the existing facilities (Infrastructure Loan-cum-Grant Scheme).

1. *Title.*— The scheme shall be called “Revised Infrastructure Loan-cum-Grant to Educational Institution”.

2. *Objective.*— The objective of the scheme is to initiate comprehensive measures for equipping every Government Aided school in the State with basic minimum infrastructural facilities. The loan is meant for the improvement of infrastructure like construction/renovation of school building, toilets/bathroom, hostel facilities, construction of playground and to purchase equipment for security of the school including CCTV. It also includes the cost of land for the purpose of construction of school building and playground only but not exceeding 50% of the total loan amount with prior permission of the Department. The expenditure on salary, consumables like chalks, dusters, laboratory

material like glass, plastic, chemicals is however not covered. Items admissible under non salary grant will not be covered.

3. *Applicability.*— Aided Educational Institutions, shall be eligible for grant of loan under the scheme subject to the fulfilment of the following requirements:

Institutions that has already started the constructions can also be covered subject to fulfillment of the conditions. Institutions that have taken benefit of this scheme in past also can utilize the Additional portion of the Grant/Loan. Defaulted schools also shall be eligible if they clear the outstanding balance due from them with 10% interest from date of default prior to application under this scheme.

(i) *Primary Schools.*— The minimum enrolment of student should be 160 in the Developed Talukas and 100 in the less Developed Talukas.

(ii) *Secondary Schools.*— The minimum enrolment of student should be 300 in the Developed Talukas and 200 in the less Developed Talukas.

(iii) *Higher Secondary Schools.*— The minimum enrolment of student should be 120 in the Developed and 80 in the less Developed Talukas.

4. *Definition.*— (i) Director means the Director of Education, Porvorim.

(ii) Government means the Government of Goa.

(iii) Government Aided Educational Institutions means the Educational Institutions running the classes from I to XII, registered with the Government, obtained recognition and registered with GBSHSSE-Porvorim following Goa School Education Act and Rules and availing the facilities of Goa Government of salary and Non-salary Grant.

(iv) Educational Institution means registered Society under Society Act, 1960,

Trust or any other recognized/registered body permitted to run the Educational Institution.

(v) Head of the School/Managing Committee means Chairman/Chairperson/President/Secretary etc., of the Institutions running the school and authorized to deal with the Education Department.

(vi) GEDC means Goa Education Development Corporation, Porvorim.

(vii) GSIDC means Goa State Infrastructure Development Corporation Limited, Panaji.

5. *Condition of Eligibility.*— To obtain financial assistance in the form of Loan-cum-Grant under this scheme by the recognized Educational Institutions, the following conditions apply:—

(i) Minimum enrolment as mentioned in the scheme.

(ii) The passing percentage is in S.S.C.E. results during the last examination should be 70% and above in the Developed Talukas whereas that in less Developed Talukas, it should be 60% and above.

(iii) The Educational Institutions should be at least of 5 years old from the date of recognition.

6. *Amount of Loan.*— (i) Primary schools more than 5 years old shall be eligible for a loan of maximum of Rs. 50 lakhs. The loan, however will be based on actual ground situation and need based.

(ii) Secondary schools more than 5 years old shall be eligible for a loan of maximum Rs. 100 lakhs. The loan, however will be based on actual ground situation and need based.

(iii) Higher Secondary schools more than 5 years old shall be eligible for a loan of maximum Rs. 200 lakhs. The loan, however will be based on actual ground situation and need based.

(iv) Composite schools—

(a) Primary and Secondary – maximum of Rs. 150 lakhs.

(b) Secondary and Higher Secondary – maximum of Rs. 300 lakhs.

(c) Primary, Secondary and Higher Secondary – maximum of Rs. 350 lakhs.

7. *Agency for Disbursement of Loan.*— The loan amount shall be disbursed to the school managing committee of the concerned school through the GEDC.

8. *Mode of Disbursement of Loan.*— (i) 30% of the amount shall be released immediately on issue of the sanction letter from the Department. After utilization of allotted amount, the school managing committee shall submit the report comprising utilization certificate, countersigned by Chartered Accountant, physical inspection and progress report countersigned by Registered Engineer (in formats annexed) to the Director of Education. After receiving the report from the school managing committee the GSIDC will inspect the site in building and evaluate the value and quality of the work done and compliance with the scheme and submit its report within a period of one month from receipt of reports from Directorate of Education.

(ii) IInd installment of 50% of the amount shall be released by the Directorate of Education only after—

(a) On production of a physical inspection and progress report countersigned by Registered Engineer and a Utilization Certificate countersigned by C. A. to the effect that the first installment of 30% has been fully utilized for the purpose for which it was granted, and

(b) After confirming the Value of “the work executed” by the school managing

committee is equal or more than the funds released by the Government and the quality of the work executed is satisfactory and as per the guidelines laid down based on the evaluation report of GSIDC.

(iii) The balance 20% on production of a similar certificate as at (ii) above to the effect that the second installment of 50% has been fully utilized for the purpose, completion and occupation of the building and based on evaluation report of GSIDC to the satisfaction of the department.

9. *Scrutiny and sanction.*— All proposals under the scheme shall be scrutinized by a committee constituting the Director of Education, Additional Director of Education, Representative of GEDC, Representative of Secretary (Finance), Joint Director of Accounts of Directorate of Education as members. The committee shall examine the proposals based on present and near future requirements of the institutions in terms of enrolment, likely growth, space constraints, land available/ acquired, details in concept paper, engineering specifications and final estimates and recommend the case if found valid along with a tentative funding under the scheme. The Government shall consider only the cases recommended by the scrutinizing committee. The scrutinizing committee may take help of GSIDC for any technical assessment that may be required.

10. *Time limit to start the work.*— The institution shall start the work within 180 days of issue of the 1st installment. Order to contractor will be at estimated cost as approved or at lesser value. (Installment value for IInd Installment of 50% will be released after adjusting the excess in Ist Installment if the actual value of work order is lesser than the estimate and sanction will be modified accordingly).

11. *Utilization period.*— The total sanctioned amount is required to be utilized in the following time limits from date of issue of **1st installment** for all fresh institutions:—

If the total **sanctioned** amount is not utilized within the above time limits, the Directorate of Education reserves the right to curtail the sanctioned amount.

12. *Mode of Repayment.*— (a) The repayment will start after 9 months of disbursement of loan irrespective of whether the Project has been completed or not. Repayment is to be paid to the GEDC as specified in sanction letter. The amount would be repaid in 15 years in equal monthly installment of Rs. 278/- per lakh on the sanctioned amount. The installment should be paid to the department on or before 5th of every month till the loan amount is fully repaid. The scheme does not require payment of interest if all payment due are paid as per the schedule and 50% of the amount is a grant. If more than three installments become due the balance outstanding amount will get converted automatically into loan @ 10% interest and payment will be adjusted from non-salary grant.

(b) If the institution fails to start the work within a period of 180 days of disbursement of first loan amount, the institution will have to deposit the entire amount disbursed to the GEDC along with interest @ 10% which will be charged on the above amount with effect from one month after the date of disbursement. In the case of institution failing to utilize the amount within the time frame as specified in the scheme, the

institution will have to deposit entire amount or balance amount left that has not been utilized along with interest @ 10% which will be charged on the total amount or balance amount unutilized with effect from one month after the date of disbursement. The amount shall be deposited GEDC as specified in sanction order in one installment by the beneficiary institution within a period of 15 days from the notice to the effect from Director of Education.

(c) In case the institutions fail to start repayment within 9 months or any further installment in time as mentioned in Para (a) above or fail to deposit the entire amount or balance amount a mentioned in Para (b) above, the same shall be recovered from payment of non-salary grant. In case the amount is more than non-salary grant the same shall be recovered by invoking the provisions of the **section 3 of Goa Public Money Recovery Act and Rules** made there under and further action also will be taken other than the action to recover the amount under the **Goa School Education Act and Rules**, i.e. if it is found that the amount standing to the credit of the school fund by way of the loan is misappropriated/ /misapplied, action will be taken against the school by invoking the **provisions of section 20 of Goa School Education Act and Rules**. All the expenditure for the said recovery shall also be required to be paid by the said institution.

13. *General.*— Where a school, which applies under this scheme, has an outstanding balance of Building Loan obtained by it from the department earlier, the same shall be adjusted against the loan to be disbursed under the scheme. The assets acquired through the finances provided under the scheme shall not carry

any rental value for purpose or re-imburement at any time in future until the loan amount is fully paid.

The Government can decide to accept or reject an application depending on its assessment. The decision of the Government shall be final for giving priority.

The Government does not undertake to acquire land.

Those schools that have been regularly disobeying the directions or orders issued by Director of Education and are found not complying with any or all of the directions under Goa School Education Act and Rules will not be considered.

The institution should utilize the loan for the purpose it was granted and not for any other purpose.

The beneficiary institution shall enter into an agreement with the Government.

The accounts of the institution shall be subject to audit by the Comptroller and Auditor General of India at his discretion as well as the internal audit of the Directorate of Education, Porvorim.

In exercise of the powers conferred under Article 187 of the Constitution of India, the Governor of Goa, after consultation with the Speaker of the Goa Legislative Assembly is hereby pleased to make the following rules relating to recruitment to the Group 'B' (Gazetted) posts in the Goa Legislature Secretariat in supersession of the existing Recruitment Rules for the relevant posts.

1. *Short title.*— These rules may be called the Goa Legislature Secretariat, Group 'B' (Gazetted) Recruitment Rules, 2013.

2. *Application.*— These rules shall apply to the posts specified in column 1 of the Schedule to these rules (hereinafter called as the "said Schedule").

3. *Number, classification and scales of pay.*— The number of posts, classification of the said post and the scale of pay attached thereto shall be specified in column 2 to 4 of the said Schedule.

4. *Method of recruitment, age limit and other qualification.*— The method of recruitment to the said post, age limit, qualification and the other matters connected therewith shall be specified in column 5 to 13 of the aforesaid Schedule.

5. *Disqualification.*— No person (1) who has entered into or contracted a marriage with a person having a spouse living; or (2) who, having a spouse living has entered into or contracted a marriage with any person, shall be eligible for appointment to the service: Provided that the Government may, if satisfied that such marriage is permissible under the personal law applicable to such person and other party to the marriage and that there are other grounds for so doing, exempt any person from the operation of this rule.

6. *Power to relax.*— Where the Government is of the opinion that it is necessary or expedient so to do, it may by order, for reasons to be recorded in writing, relax any of the provisions of these rules with respect to any class or category of persons.

7. *Savings.*— Nothing in these rules shall affect reservations, relaxation of age limit and other concessions required to be provided for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes and other special categories of persons in accordance with the orders issued by the Government from time to time in this regard.

In exercise of the powers conferred under clause (5) of the Umbrella Scheme [read at (i) above] empowering it so to do, the Government of Goa is pleased to amend the schemes read at (i), (ii) and (iii) above, so as to remove certain difficulties arising out of the implementation of the scheme(s) viz.:

(i) To extend the coverage of the scheme for providing financial relief to the truck (tipper) owners engaged in mining operations in mining affected areas, belonging to other talukas not covered in the scheme read at (ii) above; and

(ii) To cover such applicants under the scheme read at (iii) above, to provide financial relief to the people residing in Mining Affected Areas, who have lost their employment due to closure of Mining Industry, who are unable to provide documentation pertaining to P.F./E.S.I. and also to cover those whose employment has been terminated by means of having resigned or being discharged under Voluntary Retirement Schemes offered by the Mining Companies or terminated under duress due to non-renewal of contracts etc.

2. *Amendment to the scheme read at (i) above.*— After clause (3) (f) following shall be inserted:

“(g) The beneficiaries identified by the Member of the Legislative Assembly,

Member of Parliament or Gazetted Officers of States shall be scrutinized by M/s. Goa Electronics Ltd., and recommended for grant. Upon receipt of recommended applications, the Monitoring Committee shall accept recommendations by circulation or any other mode for expeditious disposal of the application.”

3. *Amendment to the scheme read at (ii) above.*—

The conditions contained in clause (1)(c), clause (2)(b) shall be relaxed to extend the coverage of the scheme for providing financial relief to the truck (tipper) owners engaged in mining operations in mining affected areas, belonging to other talukas not defined in the said clause.

4. *Amendment to the scheme read at (iii) above.*—

(a) The conditions contained in clause (2) (b), clause (2) (f) and clause (3) shall be relaxed to cover such applicants under the scheme to provide financial relief to the people residing in Mining Affected Areas, who have lost their employment due to closure of Mining Industry, who are unable to provide documentation pertaining to P.F./E.S.I. and also to cover those whose employment has been terminated by means of having resigned or being discharged under Voluntary Retirement Schemes offered by the Mining Companies or terminated under duress due to non-renewal of contracts etc.

(b) In such cases, the beneficiary is required to prove by means of documents that the applicant was employed for a minimum period of 03 years in the mining industry or such other activity related to mining industry (viz. working in mining industry, peripheral mining activity, repair workshops, mining servicing industry, repair workshops pertaining to barge/barge repair units).

(c) Evidence like regular/monthly payments being received in bank account of the beneficiary, service discharge certificate, contract documents, service rolls/wage rolls of the mining unit or mining related industrial or service units.

(d) The Monitoring Committee is empowered to consider these applications as also the type of evidence being produced to sanction them on case to case basis.

3. In case passengers desire to avail the vehicle on sharing basis, the figures in Column 5 should be divided by the capacity of the vehicle so as to arrive at per passenger cost.

4. There shall be no separate night detention charges.

5. If any vehicle of capacity, make, model is not covered in this list the permit holder shall apply to STA for fixing the fares and updating the list.

The above fares shall come into force with effect from the date of Notification published in the Official Gazette. The permit holders are required to display the fares at a prominent place in their vehicles.

The Government of Goa is pleased to frame a new Scheme: "Sahayata" (Scheme to provide Financial Assistance to Organize Programmes) as under, to replace the similar scheme notified vide No. 1/20/2010-11-ADMN/TW dated 25-03-2011.

1. *Short title & commencement.*— (a) The scheme shall be called as "Sahayata".

(b) The scheme shall come into force from the date of its notification in the Official Gazette and shall replace the scheme earlier notified in the Official Gazette, Series I No. 53 dated 31-03-2011.

2. *Definitions.*— (1) Government means the Government of Goa.

(2) Secretary means the Secretary of Tribal Welfare, Government of Goa.

(3) Director means the Director of Tribal Welfare, Government of Goa.

(4) NGO means Non-Government Organization duly registered with the competent authority under the existing Law.

(5) Committee constituted under Forest Rights Act means.

(a) Forest Rights committee constituted under Rule 3(1) of the Forest Rights Act.

(b) Committee constituted under Rule 4 (1)(e) of the Forest Rights Act.

(c) Sub-Divisional Level Committee constituted under Rule 5 of the FRA.

(d) District Level Committee constituted under Rule 7 of the FRA.

(6) Activities means activities for the upliftment of needy, poor tribal population through the schemes implemented under the Tribal Sub-Plan, for the development of tribal areas and would include programmes, knowledge, skill, attitude trainings for the forest dwelling population in understanding their lawful rights and duties under the Forest Rights Act.

3. *Objective of the Scheme.*— The objective of the scheme is to provide Financial Assistance for the purpose of organizing activities such as Seminars, Workshops, Competitions, Medical Camps, Awareness Camps etc., in the State of Goa to:

(a) Voluntary Organizations/NGOs working for the welfare of poor Scheduled Tribes in Goa.

(b) Panchayat Raj Institutions, Municipalities having majority tribal population to assist in implementing schemes and for protection of Rights of the vulnerable tribal population.

(c) Committees constituted under Forest Rights Act.

4. *Target Group and Eligibility.*— (1) The scheme shall be applicable to all the NGOs

registered under an appropriate Law in force, at least 2 years prior to making an application for Financial Assistance under this scheme.

(2) The NGO will submit Audited Statements of Accounts of last two years as well as a copy of Memorandum of Association & Article of Association while applying for financial assistance under the scheme.

(3) The NGOs applying for financial assistance under this scheme shall be working for the Welfare of Scheduled Tribes and the activities to be undertaken shall be for the cause of such sections.

(4) The scheme shall also be applicable to the Panchayat Raj Institutions/Committees constituted under Forest Rights Act.

5. *Financial Assistance.*— (a) Under the scheme a maximum amount of Rs. 50,000/- (Rupees Fifty thousand only) shall be sanctioned by the Directorate of Tribal Welfare for the purpose of undertaking any of the activity in the nature mentioned above. The amount sanctioned shall be released in two equal installments in the form of Grants. Any NGO shall be sanctioned financial assistance under the scheme only once in a period of two financial years.

(b) The NGO shall contribute at least 20% of the cost of proposed activity and the 80% of the cost shall be sanctioned under the scheme subject to the maximum of Rs. 50,000/- (Rupees Fifty thousand only). The proof of such contribution shall be provided to the Director of Tribal Welfare.

(c) The NGO/Committee constituted under Forest Rights Act/Panchayat Raj Institution will submit a statement of the organizing activities as Seminars, Workshops, Competitions, Medical Camps, Awareness Camps etc., and details of expenditure made for the said purpose, for record.

6. *Mode of Application.*— Application for financial assistance shall be submitted to the Director of Tribal Welfare in the prescribed

format at least three months in advance of the proposed activities and shall be accompanied with the following documents:

(1) A copy of Certificate of Registration issued by the Competent Authority.

(2) Detailed Project Report of the proposed activities giving financial implications.

(3) Audited accounts of the last two years.

7. *Other terms and conditions.*— (1) The grant of financial assistance under the scheme cannot be claimed as a matter of right.

(2) The amount sanctioned under this scheme shall be utilized for the purpose for which it has been sanctioned. Within a period of 15 days from the date of organization of activity, the utilization certificate as per GFR-19 and the proof of 20% contribution by NGO with detailed accounts in this regard and a report on the conduct of such activity shall be submitted to the Director of Tribal Welfare.

(3) The Panchayat Raj Institutions/Committees constituted under Forest Rights Act are eligible for 100% assistance for the conduct of programmes/activities subject to maximum of Rs. 50,000/-. Any Panchayati Raj Institution/Committee constituted under the Forest Rights Act shall be sanctioned financial assistance only once in the period of one year. The proposals have to be verified and countersigned by the Block Development Officer.

8. *Interpretation and relaxation.*— (1) The Secretary of Tribal Welfare shall be the final authority concerning the interpretation of this scheme.

(2) Government may relax any of the provision of this scheme.
